





- 2087 local bred 158 imported
- Need 2600- 2800 horses
 per month
- Clear opportunity



Populating our Racing Stock



1275 mares in 20131304 in 2012

- 2.5% decline in 2013
- 655 registered foals
- 455 registered as racehorses
- High mortality rate of foals

Outlook of Breeding



 Continuous investment in improving breeding stock every year

- Top breeders reaching out to US, Australia, NZ
- With importation of top stallions and broodmares, the opportunity to breed top quality horses is huge!






